	 Liaising with community groups or organisations to involve them in litter pick events Contacting participants with event details such as timings, where to meet etc Promoting events, for example by using social media Supervising participants during the litter pick events Being responsible for highlighting health and safety issues Taking responsibility for the distribution and collection of litter picking equipment including litter pickers, hi vis tabards, gloves etc. (These will be provided by CPRE Cheshire) Recording and reporting the types of litter collected
	 Arranging for the litter to be recycled or disposed of once the event has taken place Sending follow up communications to participants
